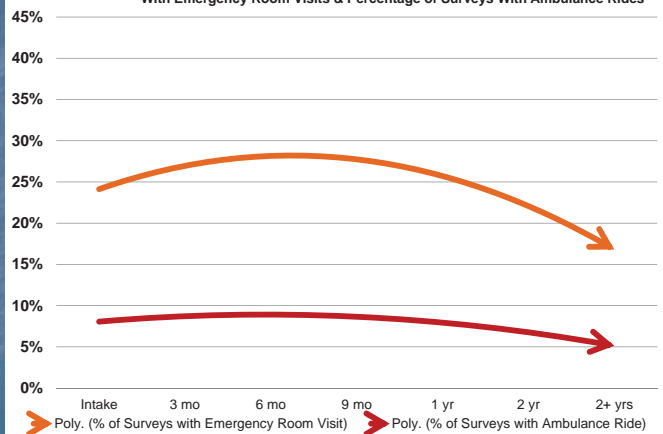

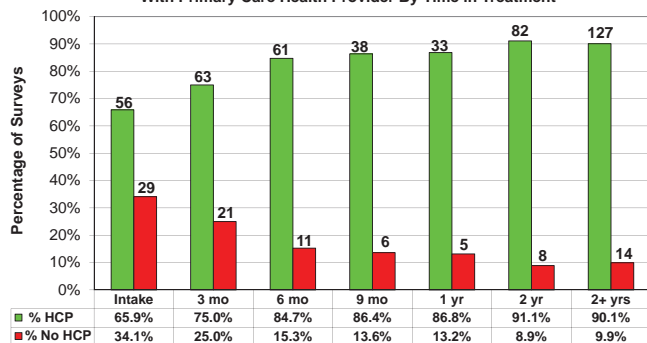

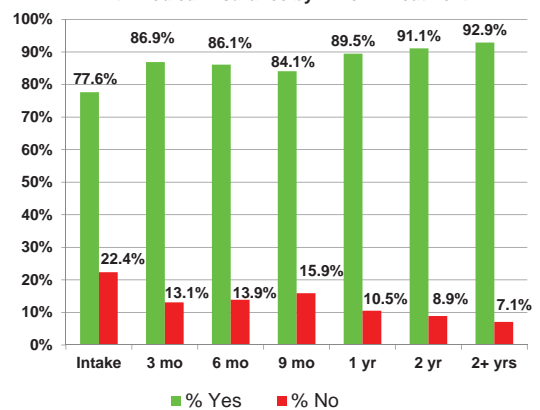

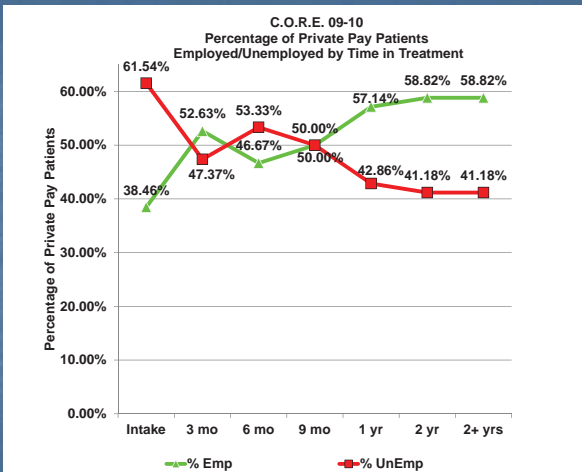
C.O.R.E. 09-10: Percentage of Surveys With Primary Care Health Provider By Time in Treatment

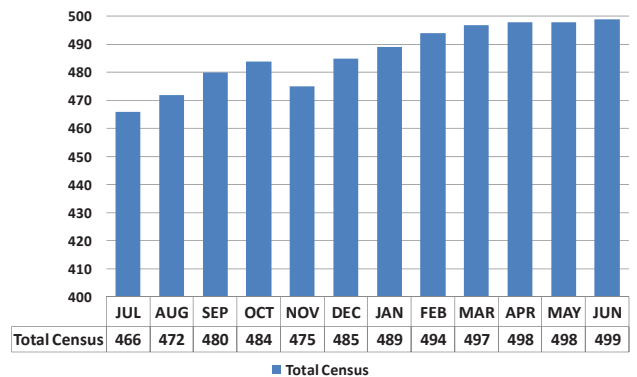

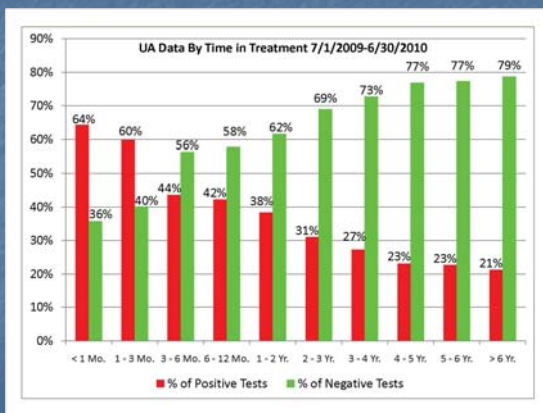

C.O.R.E. July 2009 Through June 2010 Total Census (MMP and Detox) by Month

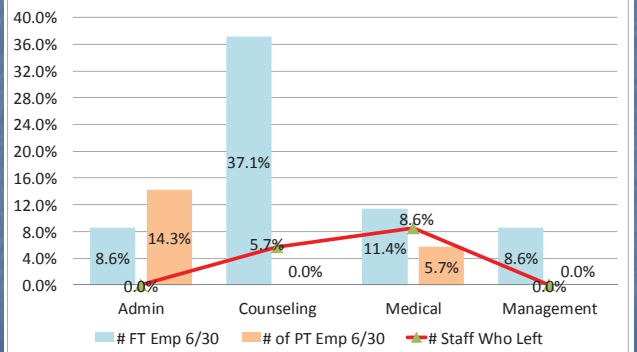

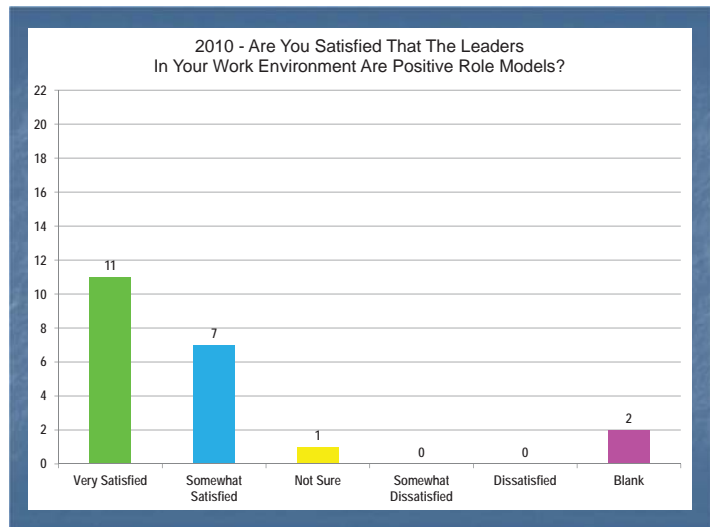
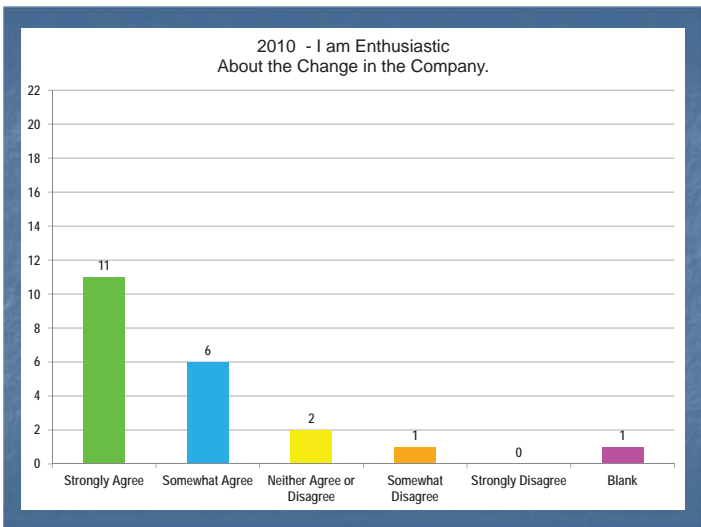
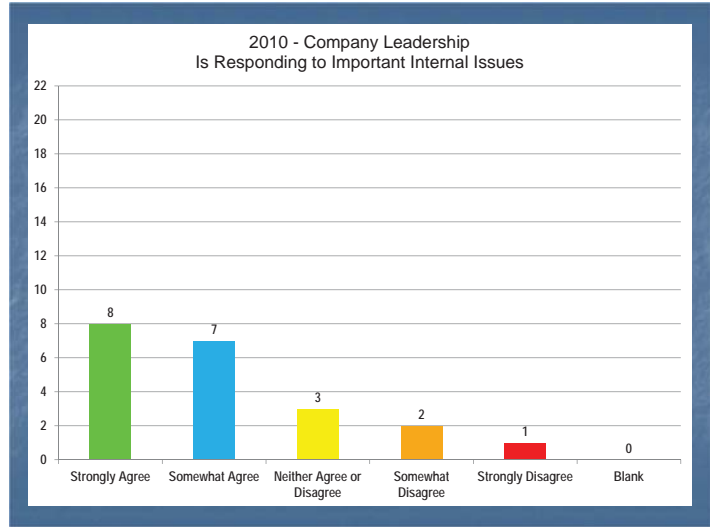
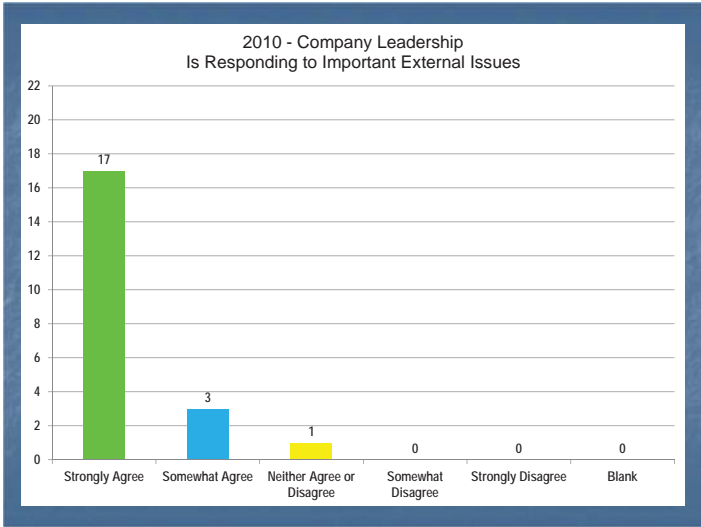
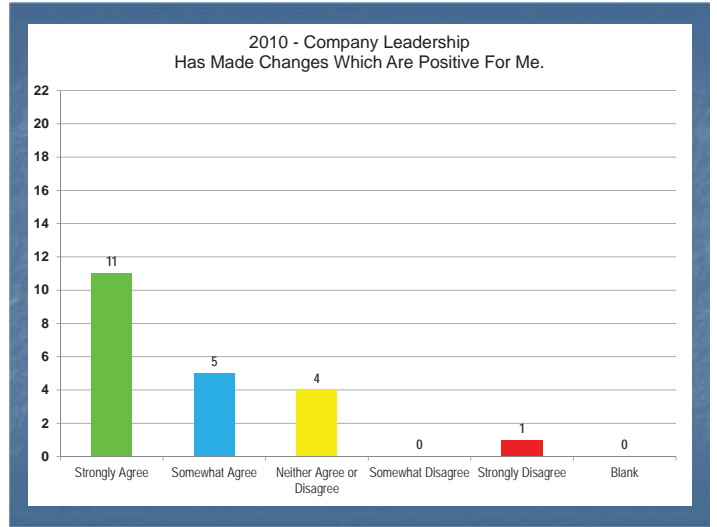
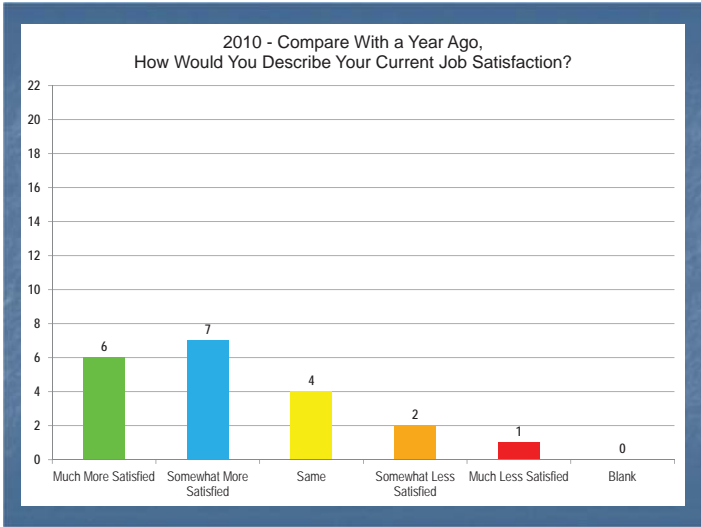


C.O.R.E. Percentage of Employees 2009-2010

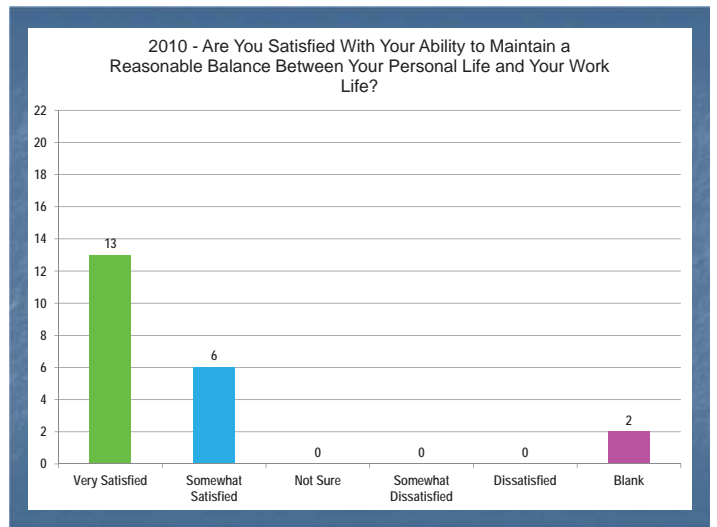
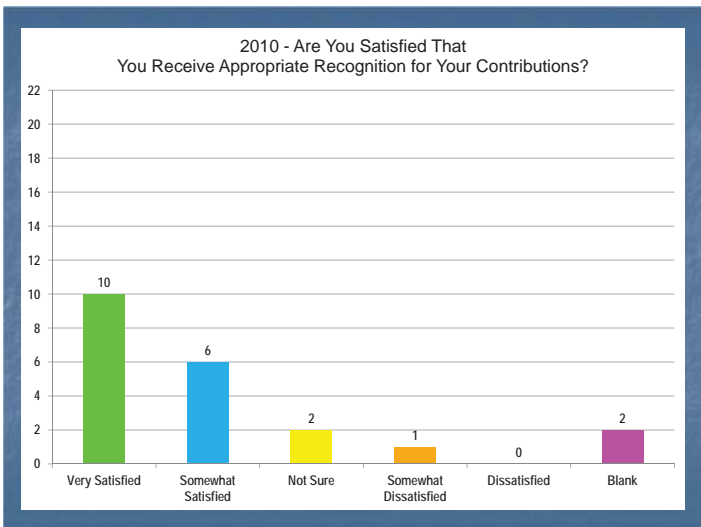
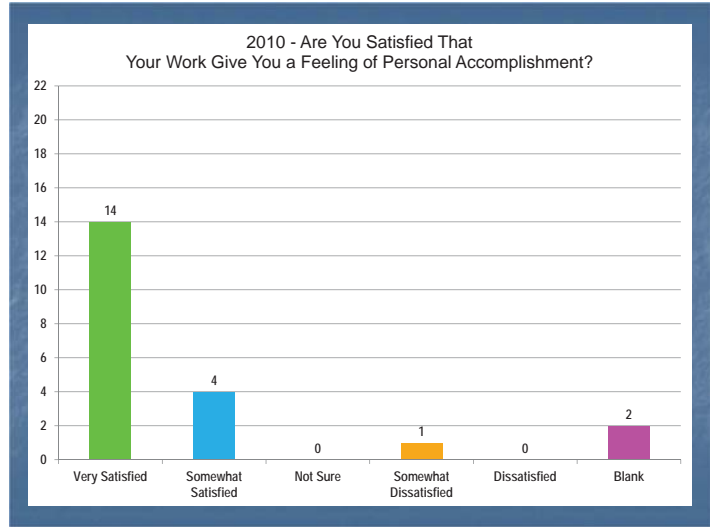
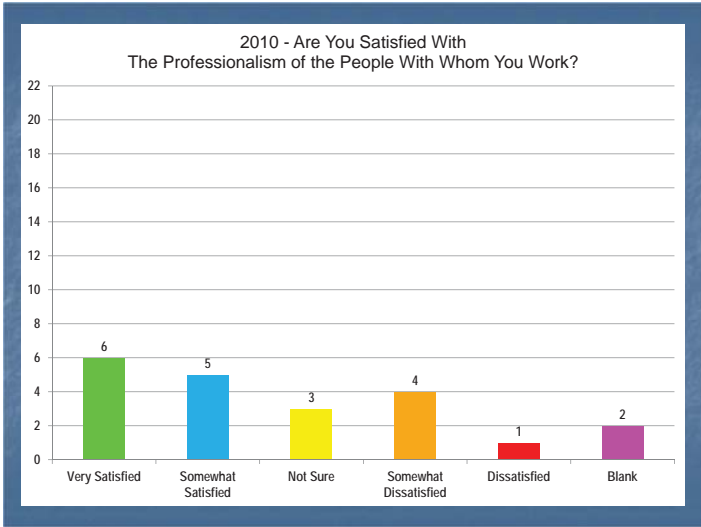
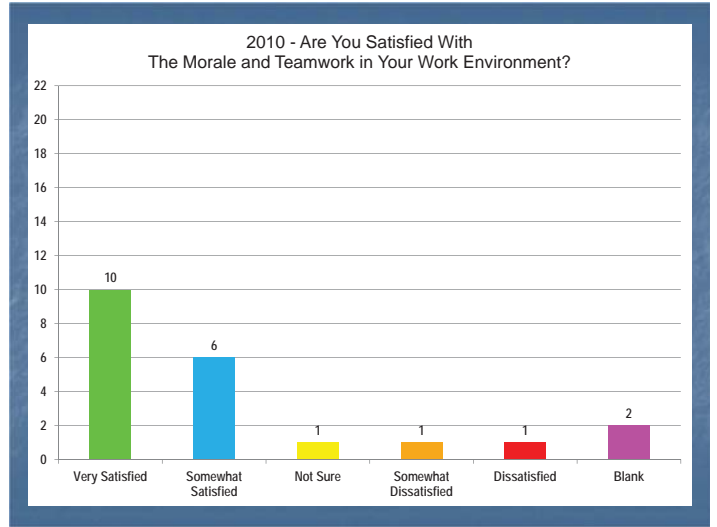
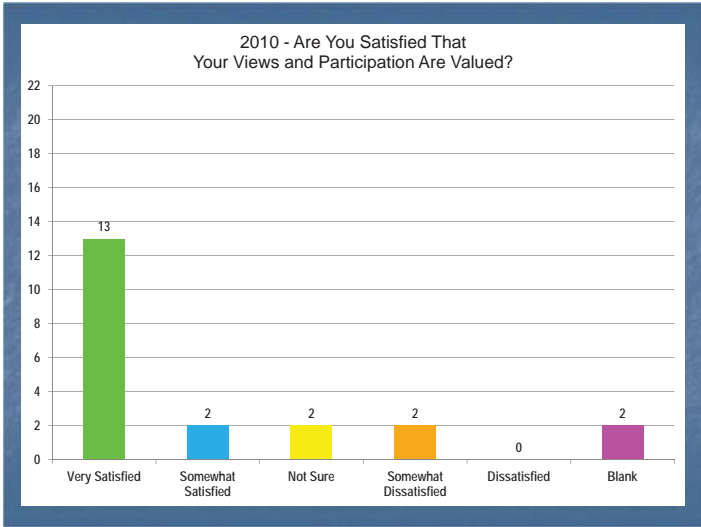

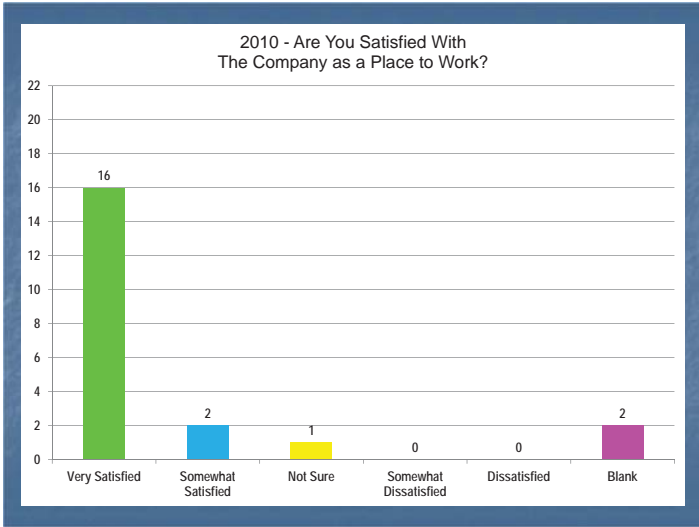
